JOIN OUR DISCUSSION & DEBRIEF ON THURSDAY AFTERNOONS

Whether you are an active remote mediator or conciliator, want to keep your skills sharp, or want to learn more about our remote process, please join us as we debrief our sessions and discuss what is important to you.

During the debriefing we talk about which mediation skills worked best and what other skills might have been used in a mediation. We start by giving a brief summary of the

case, and then focus on challenges and skills without rehashing facts and parties in a case.

National Lighthouse Day is August 7th!

On August 7th, 1787, Congress ordered for "beacons, buoys, and public piers" to be built along our coasts. However, lighthouses did exist in the United States prior to this order. In 1716, Boston Light was constructed on Little Brewster Island about nine miles east of the city and was rebuilt in 1784 after the British destroyed the original monument. While few lighthouses today have someone living in them, Boston Light remains as the only lighthouse with an actual keeper in the country. Here on Cape Cod, we have more than 20 lighthouses which are quintessential landmarks seen some at some of our most popular shores.

As Mediators, we try our best to help spread light and show direction to those seeking resolution. Like each rotation of a lighthouse and each session with party, we can turn to provide new, updated information. There may be multiple directions to a mutual agreement, and while it is
