Our Youth Conflict Resolution Program, lead by Maura Smith Stein, was honored to present their "Pathways to Peace" program in collaboration with Nauset Regional High School's Youth Mediators in The Barnstable County Human Rights Advisory Commission's recent fall session of the Human Rights Academy for students on Cape Cod.

ADVANCED DISPUTE RESOLUTION SKILLS PRACTICE TRAINING FOR MEDIATORS AND CONCILIATORS



Cape Mediation's advanced Dispute Resolution Practice Training Program is designed to provide an invaluable opportunity to practice mediation and conciliation skills. You will be paired with experienced neutrals under the supervision of our Volunteer Development Coordinator. This program is for newly trained neutrals, as well as for those that wish to gain additional advanced hands-on experience You will receive valuable feedback from our experienced Coordinators and from our Volunteer Development Coordinator. It is an important next step for anyone considering being involved in the field of Dispute Resolution.

This program is held remotely by Zoom. Completion of at least a 30-hour Basic Mediation Skills Training or an 8-hour Conciliation Training is a prerequisite.

We work hard to ensure that everyone on Cape Cod has access to our services through our new Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) efforts spearheaded by Debbie Fish. Through the efforts of our Youth Coordinator, Maura Smith Stein, we have expanded our Youth Program from our Peer Mediation at Nauset Regional High School

(NRHS) started last year, to now include programs with the HRA and the Cape Cod Lighthouse Charter School. Our volunteers are at the heart of the services we provide, and our Volunteer Development Coordinator, Susan Largay, now offers Advanced Dispute Resolution Skills Practice Training for trained mediators and conciliators. Our Coordinators, Cathie Pietrafitta and Susan Largay, are available each month to moderate our Discussion and Debriefs with volunteers from all of our programs, and also provide our new Skill-of-the-Month workshops for experienced volunteers.
