Impact of Mediation in Massachusetts

The Massachusetts Office of Public Collaboration (MOPC) serves all people in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts through their Community Mediation Center (CMC) Grant Program, supporting Community Mediation Centers throughout the state, including Cape Mediation. The program has been a tremendous success; the MOPC has found that the return on investments in mediation state-wide amounts to \$22.1 million in cost savings and leveraged resources. On January 24th, the MOPC once again presented

their annual Community Mediation Briefing for Legislators in support of state-funded Community Mediation Centers. We wish to express our gratitude to the MOPC and to the legislative supporters, Senator Paul Mark and Representative Manny Cruz, as well as to our own Barnstable Representative Sarah Peake. The Board's Corner

Housing Mediation. Governor Maura Healy in her recent inaugural address described the cost and shortage of housing in Massachusetts as unacceptable and pledged to take action to address this issue. As anyone who lives or spends time here on Cape Cod is well aware the demand for affordable housing has and continues to exceed the supply of such housing. Cape Mediation's Housing Mediation Program has been very active in mediating disputes between landlords and tenants since 2021. In light of the Governor's comments we expect Cape Mediation will continue to be very active in mediating housing disputes. If you are aware of a dispute between a landlord and tenant, we recommend that you encourage either or both parties to contact Cape Mediation to discuss the possibility of mediating the dispute before the landlord takes formal legal action.
