Recently David Brooks shared his thoughts on NPR on our country's relational crises, and his words resonated. He talked about how he often finds people do not seem to have the necessary skills to have hard conversations, but these important skills can be learned. They are made up of small actions such as actively listening and being present in the moment that have a big impact. Instead of acting out of a place of anger or blame, we can use these skills to build trust and chip away at social fragmentation. Being a good listener helps others feel seen and heard, we learn to show up instead of pulling away from each other.
