Cape Mediation Interviews Nauset Athletic Director on Impact of Captain's Leadership Workshop

Cape Mediation's Youth Program Team recently had the opportunity to speak with Nauset Regional High School's (NRHS) Athletic Director, John Mattson. John is a graduate of NRHS, has worked at the school for sixteen years, and has held the position of Athletic Director for the past ten years. His job, although extremely rewarding, comes with many challenges, including dealing with conflict. In 2024, John invited Cape Mediation to provide our workshop for the Team Captains in the sports programs at NRHS, to help students manage conflict, improve communication skills, and learn to better manage the issues they are most likely to face in their leadership roles.

Mr. Mattson spoke with us about the impact of the chain of command on conflict in the environment of a high school and how, within that chain, a lack of communication is sometimes present that can create further issues. He expressed that leading by example is one of the most important lessons students learn in leadership roles. Students who have earned a role as a leader have the responsibility to set an example for their peers. When asked about our first leadership training with Nauset in the Spring of 2024, he acknowledged that there will always be some degree of conflict in these competitive environments, but he noticed a decrease in disputes among teammates. He said that it has been beneficial for students from all different sports to come together in this training and to recognize they might have more in common than they think. Collaboration on strategies for problem-solving was indeed beneficial to those who attended our training.

We are encouraged by the positive impact these workshops have had on the students at NRHS and are grateful for the support of people in our community, including John Mattson and all the staff at NRHS. We provide our Conflict Management workshops for students and other youth groups across Cape Cod throughout the year and continue to adapt our programs based on feedback from each program to effectively tailor our programs to meet the needs of the students we work with. The Cape Mediation Youth Program is excited to have the opportunity to offer leadership workshops to students in schools across Cape Cod!
